Police Report (SE Precinct)

- National Night Out was very successful. Many neighborhood organizations participated.
- There was a report of a cutting on Monday. There was a 14-year old girl, but no cutting.
- Airport incident: Meth is an increasing problem in the city. Police encounter people every day
 who are on meth. Meth causes superhuman activity. Multiple officers usually sent to the scene
 when meth involved or suspected to be involved. Officers attempt to use the least amount of force
 possible. If you know someone using drugs, please get them help right away
- Felony Assault: A broken bottle was used to cut someone who later walked on interstate to 42nd Street. Suspect was on meth. Police had to shut down interstate and train traffic. Suspect attacked police dog with a pipe.
- Motor Vehicle theft is occurring mostly in zoo area. People have left their keys or other belongings in the car. Please do not leave your belongings in the car.
- Robberies: NONE to report.
- Felony Assault: Not high in east South Omaha
- Burglaries: High in this area. This is a good opportunity for neighborhood watches. Call the police if you see something suspicious. Get as much detail as you can. Don't leave garage door openers in the car. People are having items stolen from their yards.

- Mayor's Office
 - Town Hall Meetings will begin 9/22/16. The South Omaha meeting will be held on November 1, 2016 at the South Omaha Library
- Don Preister Bellevue City Council
 - o Shared a OWH article
- Roger Garcia MCC
 - o Fred Conley will be resigning effective 09/29/16 so situation is resolved.
 - o Currently working on the budget process.
 - o MCC is looking to collaborate with industry partners on the new facility.
 - o 50% discount on tuition for seniors available and there are options for youth
- Garry Gernandt City Council
 - o SONA served as the fiscal agent for some of the South Omaha Murals that have been developed. Councilman Gernandt shared a press release about the Polish mural.
 - o The City is current doing a pilot program proposal for waste collection that includes 2450 homes; however, none of the homes are east of 72nd street.
 - Passed 2017 budget which included amendments to get funding for PACE program and a four-week day camp in South Omaha. Councilman Gernandt is positive that the Mayor will approve.

• Letter of support for EAB Project: Diana Fiailla from Midtown Neighborhood Alliance and the Urban Bird and Nature Alliance is applying for a Nebraska Environmental Trust Grant to educate and mitigate the effect of emerald ash borer on the Omaha community, especially the historic neighborhoods. The group will work with 5 neighborhoods (prone to loss) each year to educate them about EAB, mitigation strategies, and tree planting. The project also proposes to wrap ash trees to create a visual impact and offer trolley rides to areas to show people the trees. She hopes
